Magical Memories of Matt Monro

2010 is the 25th anniversary of the death of British star Matt Monro and the 50th anniversary of his first big hit record *Portrait Of My Love*.

This Easter weekend, Radio Warneford presents a celebration of the life and music of this British legend.



Louise Drinkhall and Paul Kalus meet Matt Monro's daughter Michele who has spent the last few years writing a book about her dad called *The Singer's Singer: The Life And Music Of Matt Monro*.

Michele tells us all about her dad, his life and his music and chooses some rare recordings for us to enjoy alongside his most famous songs including *Softly As I Leave You* and the James Bond theme song *From Russia With Love*.

Matt Monro was born Terry Parsons in Shoreditch in 1930. After many different jobs including driving a London bus, Terry got his big break after coming to the attention of Fifties star Winifred Atwell who helped him sign a recording deal with Decca Records and came up with his stage name, Matt Monro.

Matt had his first big success with the song *Portrait Of My Love* produced by George Martin which reached the Top 3 in 1960. Further hits followed including *My Kind Of Girl* in 1961 and the Oscar-winning title song to the film *Born Free* in 1966.

Matt Monro represented the UK at the 1964 Eurovision Song Contest singing *I Love The Little Things* which came second.
